# Keiser Newsletter: Winter Updates and Progress

As the cold winter months settle in, we urge everyone to take precautions to protect themselves, their homes, and their vehicles. Make sure your car is prepared for emergencies by keeping it stocked with essential equipment and maintaining a full tank of gas. Winter weather can be challenging, but your city continues to operate smoothly day by day, thanks to the resilience and dedication of our community and city workers.

I want to extend a heartfelt thank you to all city employees who worked tirelessly during the recent snowstorm to clear snow from City Hall and the Post Office, ensuring the city remained operational. Your efforts exemplify the spirit of Keiser, and I am incredibly proud of our community's ability to weather these challenges together.

Despite the frigid temperatures, progress in Keiser has not slowed. Your City Council has reviewed and approved the Sewer Grant/Loan, and our city engineer is actively working on the design of our sewer to meet the Arkansas Natural Resources Commission and Health Department requirements. We anticipate work on this project to begin this summer. Additionally, the replacement of the Lift Station on Main Street has been approved, with the new station on order and scheduled for installation in late spring.

Efforts are also underway to improve our water system. We are applying for a grant from the Delta Regional Authority to install an aerator that will oxidize the water

before filtration, significantly reducing iron levels and improving the quality of our drinking water.

Exciting updates are happening in our parks as well. The newest playground equipment has arrived and is set to be installed, weather permitting, in January. This project was made possible through a \$100,000 grant from the state. Plans for a bike and walking track are moving forward, with installation scheduled for this summer. This track will provide a safe space for our citizens to exercise, and we are working with Entergy to see if it is feasible to install lights around the entire track making sure it is well-lit.

Our Volunteer Fire Department has also made significant strides, securing a \$29,425 grant to purchase three new SCBA air packs and two AWIN radios, replacing outdated equipment. These upgrades will enhance the safety and effectiveness of our firefighters as they serve the community.

Looking ahead, I am actively working with the Alliance for Rural Impact out of Harrisburg and Cotton to Steel, based here in Mississippi County, on a plan to bring businesses to Keiser. While we are still in the very early stages, this collaboration is a promising step forward. Developing a comprehensive plan will take time, but we are committed to making this vision a reality.

Keiser's future continues to look bright, and I am proud of the progress we have achieved together. Thank you for your continued support, and stay safe during these cold winter days!



## **Improving our Water Quality**

# Enhancing Keiser's Water Quality: Pursuing a Delta Regional Authority Grant for an Aerator System

The City of Keiser takes great pride in ensuring residents have access to safe and reliable water. Water is not just a resource—it's a cornerstone of health, economic growth, and overall quality of life in our community. To uphold this commitment, we are actively pursuing funding through the Delta Regional Authority (DRA) to install an Aerator System, a cutting-edge solution that will significantly improve our water quality.

Like many communities in Arkansas, Keiser's water supply comes from a city well that contains naturally occurring iron. While iron in water isn't a health hazard, it can create several challenges, such as discolored water, sediment buildup, staining of plumbing fixtures and laundry, and an unpleasant metallic taste. Currently, our water treatment system removes a substantial portion of the iron through filtration at our treatment house, but some iron still passes through. Over time, this residual iron can accumulate, affecting water quality and the efficiency of household plumbing and appliances. Addressing this issue is a top priority for Keiser.

To tackle this challenge, we plan to install an Aerator System. This advanced technology improves water quality by introducing air into the water supply, oxidizing the iron and converting it from a dissolved form into solid particles. Once oxidized, the iron becomes much easier to filter out, resulting in clearer, fresher, and better-tasting water. Beyond improving water quality, the Aerator System will bring long-term benefits to our water infrastructure by reducing wear and tear on pipes, pumps, and other components, leading to fewer maintenance issues and a more sustainable system.

Funding is a critical component of this project, and the Delta Regional Authority grant is an ideal resource for making it happen. Designed to support economic development and infrastructure improvements in the Delta region, the grant aligns perfectly with our goals for this project. If awarded, the grant will provide the financial support needed to install the Aerator System without placing additional costs on residents. This project will not only enhance water quality but also position Keiser as a leader in innovative infrastructure improvements.

The installation of an Aerator System will bring numer-

ous benefits to the community. Residents will experience improved water quality, including clearer, freshertasting water with fewer staining and sediment issues. Additionally, reducing iron levels will extend the lifespan of our pipes, pumps, and household plumbing systems. Reliable water quality is also a key factor in attracting new residents and businesses, supporting Keiser's long-term growth. Aeration is an environmentally friendly solution, furthering our commitment to responsible resource management.

This effort is part of a broader strategy to invest in infrastructure, promote community health, and ensure Keiser remains a great place to live, work, and raise a family. We are grateful for the continued support and encouragement from our residents, whose advocacy and feedback help secure the resources needed for projects like this. As we move through the grant application process, we are working closely with engineers, consultants, and regional partners to ensure the success of this proposal.
